Joining a FHN or FHO

The Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care has guidelines regarding joining a FHN or a FHO.

There are three main ways to join one of these groups:

- Practise in an area of high physician need;
- Replace an existing physician in a non high-need area; or
- Participate in the New Graduate Entry Program. These three options are described below.

Practise in an area of high physician need

The easiest way to join a FHN or FHO is to practise in an area of high need. The <u>Areas of High Physician Need list</u> is available on the MOHLTC website and is based on rurality, physician-to-population ratios, and input from the Local Health Integration Networks (LHINs). In a process referred to as Managed Entry, up to 20 new physicians per month may join a FHN or FHO on this list, and are also eligible to participate in the ministry's <u>Income Stabilization program</u>.

Become a replacement physician at an existing FHN or FHO

By replacing a FHN or FHO physician in a non-high-need area, a new physician can assume another physician's practice without going through the managed entry process. A common example of a physician joining a FHN or FHO as a replacement physician is a new family physician graduate taking over the practice of a retiring physician.

Participate in the New Graduate Entry Program (NGEP) in a non-high-need area

The MOHLTC also offers the New Graduate Entry Program (NGEP) to new family medicine graduate physicians who wish to join a FHN or FHO that is not located in an identified area of high physician need.

Eligible physicians who accept the terms of the NGEP are compensated at a graduated annual fixed rate of payment for a minimum of three years upon commencement with the FHN/FHO group.
